Episode One:

Scene One: Inside the Penny Pincher's Theatre: Day

- 1. SOUND WE HEAR AN OLD THEATRE CURTAIN SLOWLY OPENING
- 2. NARRATOR Here we are, back at the old Pennypincher's Theatre, London, England, 1875. The cast and crew are back at work after their brief hiatus and are discussing their new season.
- 3. SOUND DOOR CREAKING OPEN
- 4. SOUND WHISTLING, THEN HARD SOLED SHOES
 CROSSING A HARD WOOD STAGE FLOOR
- trusty stage manager. Here, early as usual to get the theatre ready for the actors, and also the important people. They're coming too. She has opened the curtains and is about to cross the bare stage. As always she carries her clipboard, and though quite unusual, a washcloth.
- 6. SOUND SHOES SUDDENLY STOP
- 7. LINDA Yet, here's a spot
- 8. NARRATOR She's always been good with Shakespeare.
- 9. SOUND FLOOR BEING SCRUBBED

1. LINDA Oh, will these floors ne'er be cleaned?!

2. SOUND DOOR OPENING AND SHOES ON THE FLOOR

3. DIRECTOR (from off) Ms. VanPatton? Linda? Are you

already here?

4. LINDA I'm here, Mr. Jamison. Just finishing up.

5. SOUND FOOTSTEPS APPROACHING

(DIRECTOR NILES JAMISON has entered with OSCAR WILDE)

6. DIRECTOR Linda I would like you to meet
Oscar Wilde. He's a charming new playwright in town and he's
going to sit in on our company meeting today.

7. OSCAR WILDE How, do you do, Ms. VanPatton?

8. LINDA I'm fine. Wow. Your accent is so fancy and pretentious.

9. OSCAR WILDE I use cologne for mouthwash

10.LINDA That's strange

11.OSCAR WILDE Thank you.

12.DIRECTOR Linda, I was hoping you could, sort of, take Mr. Wilde under your wing-show him around a little.

13.LINDA Well, alright

14.SOUND KNOCKING AT THE DOOR

1. LINDA To bed! To bed! There's a knocking at the gate! Fie my Lord, Fie! I'll be back!

2. OSCAR WILDE Did she tell you to go to bed?

3. DIRECTOR She's quoting Shakespeare

4. OSCAR WILDE She's very good

5. SOUND SCUFFLE; ARGUING

6. DIRECTOR Sounds like someone's here a little early. It also sounds like they're a little angry

7. OSCAR WILDE In my opinion that's the best way to sound.

8. INGENUE (from off) Where is he? I want to speak to him right now!

9. OSCAR WILDE I'm assuming she means you.

FLOOR

10.SOUND HEAVY HEELED SHOES ACROSS THE

11.INGENUE Mr. Jamison! What's this I hear about us performing Romeo and Juliet?!

12.DIRECTOR Hello Ms. Butterfly. I hope you had a nice Holiday. Where'd we go this year? The Alps?

13.INGENUE Spain, but don't change the subject! I want to know why in the heck you chose Romeo and Juliet? Again?!

1. OSCAR WILDE What's wrong with Romeo and Juliet?

It's a classic.

2. INGENUE & DIRECTOR It's Shakespeare. They're all classics!

3. OSCAR WILDE Good point. How do you do Ms. Butterfly?

- 4. INGENUE (rushed an irritated but still a southern lady)
 Charmed I'm sure.
- 5. DIRECTOR What's the big deal, Kathleen? You play the beautiful, young, innocent Juliet opposite Lance and everyone loves you and we can afford to keep our lights on.
- 6. INGENUE That's just the thing (She starts to cry). This was supposed to be my breakout role. I was to play Cleopatra, the headstrong, scheming, brilliant Queen! You said so yourself! But, there's no Cleopatra on the schedule!
- 7. DIRECTOR There's Lady M
- 8. INGENUE That's better...
- 9. DIRECTOR Oscar, this is the resident
 Ingenue, Ms. Kathleen Butterfly. She and her husband Lance
 Ryder moved here from the states. As in America. Lance is our leading man.
- 10.OSCAR WILDE Thrilling story. What happens next?

- DIRECTOR (to INGENUE) Look, I know we discussed you playing meatier roles...
- 2. INGENUE We didn't just discuss it! You promised!
- 3. DIRECTOR So, I may have promised you would play a meatier role, but box office sales were lower than expected, so we really need something that will bring in an audience.
- 4. INGENUE But Romeo and Juliet is so overdone. Especially by us!
- 5. DIRECTOR It's a crowd pleaser
- 6. INGENUE So? Since when has the theatre cared about pleasing crowds?
- 7. DIRECTOR The others will be here soon. Why don't you go to your dressing room? Linda will bring you those lovely cucumber sandwiches you like so much.
- 8. OSCAR WILDE Cucumber sandwiches?
- 9. DIRECTOR She loves them.
- 10.INGENUE (through tears) It's only because I could never get something so awful in the states.
- 11.OSCAR WILDE Makes perfect sense.
- 12.DIRECTOR Rest now. The others will be here soon.

1. INGENUE (sniffles) Okay. Lovely to meet you Mr. Wilde.

2. OSCAR WILDE Pleasure's all yours...

3. DIRECTOR Sorry about that Mr. Wilde. Where

were we?

4. OSCAR WILDE I believe Linda was making me a

cucumber sandwich.

5. DIRECTOR Indeed. Follow me, Mr. Wilde

6. SOUND FOOTSTEPS MOVING AWAY

Scene Two: Inside Pennypincher's Theatre: Day

1. SOUNDS TALKING, HUBHUB, LAUGHING, SINGING,
PRACTICING SHAKESPEARE IN THE BACKGROUND, MUSIC

2. NARRATOR Ah, it's such an exciting feeling when all the actors have arrived. The energy is so high, the anticipation is so great, the volume level is so unnecessary.

(it gets quieter) Thank you. Here we are, day one. The singers are warming up, the jugglers are here for some reason.

3. JUGGLER They'll use me someday

4. NARRATOR Will they, though?

5. JUGGLER The juggle is real!

6. NARRATOR Everyone's on the edge of their seat, just waiting for their much loved director to take the stage. And here he is! (sound gets quiet. A few "shhhs")

1. SOUND SHOES ACROSS THE FLOOR

2. DIRECTOR Ladies and Gentlemen welcome back to your home, the Pennypincher's Theatre of London. I am the Director and Producer, Niles Jamison.

3. SOUND APPLAUSE AND WHISTLES

4. DIRECTOR I am here, of course, to announce our new season (CHEERS) and also to introduce you to Oscar Wilde. He is a new playwright and he's interested in cutting his teeth in our theatre. And I don't just mean on the cucumber sandwiches (LAUGHTER). Please allow him to mill about, take notes, and generally spy on everything you do.

5. SOUND LAUGHTER & CHEERS

- 6. OSCAR WILDE It's wonderful to meet everyone. Even the juggler.
- 7. JUGGLER The juggle is real!
- 8. DIRECTOR As for our season, we will be opening with Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet.

9. SOUND A FEW GROANS

- 10.INGENUE I told you!
- 11.DIRECTOR That heartwarming tragedy will be followed by the equally heartwarming greek tragedy, *Prometheus Bound*.

1. SOUND OFF CUTTING REMARKS, LIKE "OH,

GREAT." OR "REALLY, WHY?" OR "I'M GOING BACK TO ACCOUNTING".

2. DIRECTOR I know these tragedies are not the most upbeat of stories, but our third production will be the swash-buckling Pirates of Penzance!

3. SOUND EXCITED CHEERS

- 4. OSCAR WILDE They sure do love their Pirate musicals.
- 5. DIRECTOR I'm hoping it's just a phase. And finally, we will close the season with "The Scottish Play"

6. SOUND OOOOOOOHHHHHHH

- 7. HUMPFREY Finally! A role for me!
- 8. DIRECTOR (whispers) That's Humpfrey McOltimer. He's been here a long time. Holding out for King Lear.
- 9. HUMPFREY I heard that!
- 10.DIRECTOR Did he though...?
- 11.LINDA Alright everyone that's our season.
- 12.OSCAR WILDE Is that a wash cloth hanging from her clipboard?
- 13.LINDA Let us go ahead and introduce ourselves to those we haven't yet met. I'm Linda VanPatton. I

am your stage manager. I believe in order and cleanliness. I'm not your mother. Clean up after yourselves.

- 1. HUMPFREY If only my mother were here to defend herself.
- 2. LINDA That is unfortunate Mr. McOltimer.

 I'm assuming your mother has passed on...
- 3. HUMPFREY No, she just hates the theatre.

 Hello everyone I'm Humpfrey McOltimer. I've been here a long time.
- 4. LANCE RYDER Hello, friends. I'm Lance Ryder.

 I'm the leading man. I'm originally from Georgia. The state.

 In America. Land of the free. Home of the brave. Let freedom
- 5. SOUND A OLD TIMEY TELEPHONE RINGS
- 6. DIRECTOR Linda, please answer that.
- 7. LINDA Certainly sir.
- 8. SOUND LINDA'S SHOES RUNNING OFF
- 9. INGENUE Hello I'm Kathleen Butterfly and I am sick and tired of being the ingenue
- 10.DIRECTOR Thank you Kathleen, we'll all keep that in mind.
- 11.SOUND LINDA'S SHOES RETURNING
- 12.LINDA That was our benefactor. He says he's pulling his money if we don't add in a murder mystery.

1. SOUND CHEERS & OOOOOHHHH

2. DIRECTOR What? He can't be serious

3. LINDA As a heart attack

4. DIRECTOR But murder mysteries are so...this century! Oh, how I hate being topical!

5. LANCE RYDER You shouldn't go to Florida then

6. INGENUE He said topical, not tropical you dolt!

7. DIRECTOR Great. Now I have to find another script. And a murder mystery. What a kick in the head.

8. OSCAR WILDE Murder? Now that is always a mistake. One should never do anything that one cannot talk about after dinner.

9. LINDA Alright chaps, that's a day. Go home, get some rest, and let us know if you get any murder mysteries ideas.

10. SOUND GROANS, TALKING, SINGING AS THE

ACTORS LEAVE THE THEATRE

11.NARRATOR The excitement! The challenge! The refreshing wit of Oscar Wilde!

12.OSCAR WILDE You're welcome

13.NARRATOR Wait. Can they hear me?

- 1. OSCAR WILDE No, I just say "you're welcome" every ten minutes as I assume I'm receiving a compliment.
- 2. NARRATOR Tune in next time to see what happens on the first day of rehearsals!
- 3. SOUND QUICK MUSIC IN & OUT

Episode Two:

Scene One: Inside the Pennypincher's Theatre: Night

- 1. MUSIC SPOOKY, HALLOWEEN MUSIC
- 2. NARRATOR (VO) Ah, the sound technicians are getting the witches' scene together for The Scottish Play. Sounds spooky. You know what I mean when I say The Scottish Play don't you? That's right: The Tragedy of MacBeth, or Macbeth for short.
- 3. SOUND LIGHTING & THUNDER. MUSIC STOPS
- done. Anyway, like I was saying, the play, *MacBeth* is often referred to as *The Scottish Play* among other names because of the long held superstition that saying the word MacBeth in a theatre is bad luck and can cause anything from silly mishaps to bad ticket sales to mayhem and tragedy...
- 5. SOUND LIGHTING & THUNDER

Must be actually storming outside.

That sounds so real! Anyhow, I can say it of course because

I'm not actually in a theatre...I'm just looking at a theatre,

so no worries here. But remember folks: never say the word

Macbeth in the theatre. It's bad, bad, very bad...luck

1. SOUND LIGHTING & THUNDER

- 2. Ahhh looks like our company members are filing in. Sure hope everyone made it here okay! (GENERAL CONVERSATION, VOCAL WARM UPS, TALKING, ETC.)
- 3. DIRECTOR Hello everyone (CHATTER DIES DOWN) and welcome to our first night of rehearsals. And a big 'welcome back' to Mr. Oscar Wilde. Mr. Wilde, is there anything we can get you to make you feel more at home?
- 4. OSCAR WILDE

 Yes, thank you, I'll take my coffee in bed tomorrow morning.
- 5. DIRECTOR I mean here. Now. In the theatre.

 Now. Also, I literally don't even know where you're staying in town.
- 6. OSCAR WILDE In that case, no.
- 7. DIRECTOR Very well then. Tonight we will begin rehearsals, so get ready to expand and explore the text!

 Ms. VanPatton will give you further instructions. Is she here?

 (COMPANY MEMBERS DISCUSS WHERE LINDA MIGHT BE)

1. DIRECTOR Oh dear. I hope she made it in through this terrible storm we are having.

- 2. SOUND LIGHTNING AND THUNDER
- 3. LINDA (from off) I'm here! I'm here!
- 4. SOUND LINDA'S SHOES APPROACHING
- 5. Sorry about that! I was, um, cleaning something.
- 6. DIRECTOR Naturally. Well I'm turning the floor over to you, Linda. Everyone listen. You know stage managers hate to repeat themselves.
- 7. LINDA We do
- 8. HUMPFREY What's that?!
- 9. LINDA (shouting) I SAID WE DO!
- 10.HUMPFREY You do what now?
- 11.LINDA Today we will be starting our rehearsals for Romeo & Juliet. I'd like for our principal actors to introduce themselves, starting with Romeo, who will be played by our very own heartthrob, Lance Ryder. Lance, what attracts you to the role of Romeo?
- 12.LANCE RYDER Hello y'all. I'm so happy to be playing Romeo. I like him. He's a guy... (BEAT)
- 13.LINDA Thank you, Lance Ryder
- 14.OSCAR WILDE Truly inspirational.

1. LINDA His lovely wife will be playing Juliet: Ms. Kathleen Butterfly.

2. INGENUE Did you say "loving"?

3. LINDA No, I said "lovely"

4. INGENUE Oh, good. Anyway, I hate you all

5. OSCAR WILDE I'll have what she's having.

6. LINDA Thank you Mr. Wilde but there's no need to comment on what everyone else is saying.

7. OSCAR WILDE You're welcome.

8. LINDA Humpfrey McOltimer will be playing
Lord Capulet

9. HUMPFREY Finally, the leading man!

10.LINDA Other roles will be played by company members...

11.JUGGLER Do you need a juggler?

12. LINDA Actually the role of Tybalt is still needing to be filled, so why don't you come on stage and practice sword fighting with Lance Ryder?

13.LANCE RYDER Well, that doesn't sound safe.

Does he have any training?

14.JUGGLER/LINDA I'm a juggler/He's a juggler

15.LANCE RYDER Good enough for me.

16.SOUND SWORD-FIGHTING

- 1. LINDA (VO) While they fight the rest of you must get fitted for your masks for the masquerade scene. It is of the upmost importance that you meet with the costume department right away.
- 2. LANCE RYDER Excuse me, Ms. VanPatton?
- 3. LINDA Yes, Lance Ryder?
- 4. LANCE RYDER I really dislike wearing masks.

 They're uncomfortable. After a while they make me feel so tired.
- 5. LINDA Well, luckily this is a short scene...
- 6. LANCE RYDER That IS lucky! Could you imagine having to wear masks all the time? I hope that never happens to me.
- 7. LINDA It would be annoying
- 8. LANCE RYDER Indeed! I mean, what if you had to wear them to buy your groceries or get your haircut?! That would be terrible.
- 9. LINDA Yes, surely that would be terrible
- 10.LANCE RYDER Indeed! I mean, what if children had to wear them at school and adults had to wear them at concerts?
- 11.LINDA For sure...it would be...

1. INGENUE Lance! For goodness sakes, shut up and finish your fight scene!

2. LANCE RYDER Sorry honey! (gasps as if he's been hit)

3. ALL Lance Ryder! Are you okay?! Is he okay?

4. LANCE RYDER Yes, y'all

5. LINDA He's fine

6. INGENUE Did that juggler stab you?

7. LANCE RYDER Actually I think Linda did

8. INGENUE Linda!

9. LINDA A touch, a touch, I do confess!

But, he wouldn't stop talking. He's not even cut. I just whacked him one on his biscuits.

10.LANCE RYDER It hurt though...

11.OSCAR WILDE Did someone say biscuits? I'm starving.

12. HUMPHREY Me too!

13.LINDA Everyone! If you could please make your way to costumes to get fitted for your masks. And next time please eat dinner beforehand!

14.SOUND GROANS & FOOTSTEPS SHUFFLING OFF

15.OSCAR WILDE MacBeth

(EVERYONE GASPS)

1. DIRECTOR What did you say?

2. OSCAR WILDE This whole time I've been trying to figure out what you meant by The Scottish Play

3. DIRECTOR Oh no...

4. OSCAR WILDE And you were talking about Shakespeare's M...

5. DIRECTOR Don't say it!

6. OSCAR WILDE MacBeth!

(GASPS! SCREAMS OF HORROR)

7. DIRECTOR Quick! Who knows the antidote?!

(CONFUSION: "I DON'T KNOW IT, THIS NEVER HAPPENS", ETC)

8. HUMPHREY I know it!

9. DIRECTOR Oh, thank heavens. Humphrey come quick. Quicker than that. Can he be carried? Finally!

10.HUMPHREY Okay, Mr. Wilde, listen carefully!

You must now do everything I tell you to do, exactly as I tell

you to do it.

11.OSCAR WILDE I find following instructions to be so 18th century.

12.HUMPHREY Are you ready?

13.OSCAR WILDE Hold on, let me comb my hair first

14. ALL Mr. Wilde!

1. OSCAR WILDE

Sorry...go ahead

2. HUMPHREY First you must clap your hands four times (HE DOES). Now whistle a song completely out of tune and rhythm (HE DOES). Now wave your hands in the air like you just

3. OSCAR WILDE

don't care

I beg your pardon?

4. HUMPHREY

Hop up and down (HE DOES). Now,

yodel (HE DOES), Now say "Cellar Door" 3 times fast (HE DOES).
Spin around...(HE DOES) and...spit (HE DOES)

(COMPANY MEMBERS BREATHE SIGHS OF RELIEF)

5. DIRECTOR Well, now that that little hiccup is out of the way, please report to the costume department.(to OSCAR WILDE) Well, Mr. Wilde. You've really had a first hand look of the dramas of the theatre, haven't you?!

6. OSCAR WILDE

Yes. And here I thought the only
thing tragic would be their performances.

7. DIRECTOR Lets say you and I retire for a bit of tea?

8. OSCAR WILDE A most excellent idea

9. INGENUE (SCREAMS)

10.OSCAR WILDE What was that?

11.DIRECTOR Sounded like Madame Butterfly

1. SOUND	FOOTSTEPS RUNNING. EVERYONE BACK ON
STAGE	
2. INGENUE	Shhummbboddiisssh puzzz pebbles in
maaaay massshhkeee!!!!	
3. DIRECTOR	Ms. Butterfly! Are you alright?
What has happened?	
4. INGENUE	Shhummbboddiisssh puzzz peppily in
maaaay massshhkeee!!!!	
5. DIRECTOR	Lance Ryder! Do you know what she's
saying?	
6. LANCE RYDER	Ishhhrrealllycanitquitemakesitouts
7. DIRECTOR	Lance, take off your mask
8. LANCE RYDER	Oh, yeah, that's better. No, I
can't understand a word sh	e's saying.
9. OSCAR WILDE	Her lips are all swollen and she
can't talk.	
10.INGENUE	Shhummbboddiisssh puzzz pebbles in
maaaay massshhkeee!!!!	
11.OSCAR WILDE	That's sweet dear, but no, I got
this at Nordstroms.	
12.JUGGLER	I think she's trying to tell us
what happened!	
13.DIRECTOR	Who's that guy?

1. JUGGLER The juggle is real!

2. LINDA Quiet everyone! Is she cut

anywhere?

3. INGENUE Shhummbboddiisssh puzzz pebbles in

maaaay massshhkeee!!!!

4. LINDA Kathleen, did your mask prick you

at all when you put it on?

5. INGENUE Noll1

6. LINDA I'm assuming that's means "no".

Lance Ryder, is she allergic to anything?

7. INGENUE Pebbles!!

8. LANCE RYDER No, I don't think so.

9. INGENUE Yeath I ammishh, yousss

bbufffooooonnalls!

10.HUMPHREY I think she's saying she IS

allergic

11.LANCE RYDER I can't really say...

12.INGENUE YEATH! I'MMM ASHELERIG TO PEBBLES!

Shhummbboddiisssh puzzz pebbles in maaaay massshhkeee!!!!

13.LANCE RYDER I truly think she has no allergies

14. HUMPHREY She's saying she does...

15.INGENUE PEBBLES!

16.HUMPHREY Pebbles?

1. INGENUE PEBBLES!

2. DIRECTOR Well, that really makes no sense

3. LANCE RYDER Pebbles? Honey, I feel like I don't know you at all

4. INGENUE (screams) PEBBLES!!

5. JUGGLER Could she be saying "peppers"?

6. DIRECTOR Who are you?

7. INGENUE YEEASSHHH PEBBLES!

8. LANCE RYDER Oh, yes. She's allergic to peppers.

And it lasts for days. Then, she has to do massive mouth

training to get back on track. It's likely she won't recover

in time to do Romeo & Juliet!

(GASPS)

9. DIRECTOR She's fainted!

10.INGENUE Shhummbboddiisssh puzzz pebbles in

maaaay massshhkeee!!!!

11.DIRECTOR Okay now she's fainted. Well,

don't just stand around. Someone call a doctor

12. ALL (into the air) Doctor? Doctor?

13.DIRECTOR On the telephone. They've been

invented by now!

14.OSCAR WILDE What an unfortunate day

- 1. DIRECTOR It's okay, Mr. Wilde. You didn't know about The Scottish Play
- 2. OSCAR WILDE I was referring to the fact that I never got the tea you promised, but, yes, the whole pepper mask thing is truly unfortunate.
- 3. DIRECTOR Everyone head home. I will get to the bottom of this, but as of now everyone's a suspect and will be treated as such. Do not trust each other. You must all be handled like the scum of the earth. Therefore, it is advised you take the train home tonight.

(GROANS)

- 4. DIRECTOR Let us get Ms. Butterfly to the hospital. We'll all meet back here tomorrow. Goodnight.
- 5. SOUND QUICK MUSIC IN & OUT
